

a term of four years and shall receive an annual salary of seventeen thousand five hundred dollars, seven thousand six hundred dollars to be paid by the state, in equal monthly installments, and the balance of nine thousand nine hundred dollars to be paid by the city of New Orleans, in equal monthly installments. He shall receive no other compensation.

He shall be a licensed attorney and shall perform all duties now prescribed by law or hereafter prescribed by the Legislature. He shall appoint the necessary assistants to the district attorney of the parish of Orleans who shall be licensed attorneys and the necessary clerks, stenographers and special officers for the district attorney and fix their salaries which shall be paid by the city of New Orleans.

The city of New Orleans shall provide a sum of not less than one hundred and twenty-four thousand dollars per annum for the payment of the salaries of the assistant attorneys, clerks, stenographers and special officers, and the expense of the district attorney's office.

The assistant district attorneys, clerks, stenographers and special officers may be removed at the discretion of the district attorney.

Repealing clause.

Section 2. All laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

ACT No. 45

House Bill No. 131. By: Messrs. Holt, Munson, Teekell and Cashio and Senator Downs.

AN ACT

To appropriate the sum of Six Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$650,000.00) out of the General Fund of the State of Louisiana for the fiscal year 1959-1960 to the Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College to expand its facilities at Chambers in the vicinity of Alexandria, Louisiana; to provide for the withdrawal of said funds from the state treasury upon warrant of the President of said institution accompani-

ed by proof that the Congress of the United States has authorized the use for general educational purposes of the land at Chambers granted by the federal government to the state for agricultural and vocational training; and to direct the Board of Supervisors of said institution to utilize said funds for the expansion of the facilities at Chambers to no more than those which are suitable and appropriate for a two-year commuter's* college of higher learning.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. The sum of Six Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$650,000.00) is hereby appropriated out of the General Fund of the State of Louisiana for the fiscal year 1959-1960 to the Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College for the purpose of expanding the facilities of that institution at Chambers in the vicinity of Alexandria. Appropriation to LSU to expand facilities at Chambers.

Section 2. The funds appropriated by this Act may be withdrawn from the state treasury upon warrant of the President of the Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College accompanied by proof that the Congress of the United States has authorized the use for general educational purposes of the land at Chambers acquired by the Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College as a grant from the federal government to the state for agricultural and vocational training. Withdrawal of funds.

Section 3. The funds appropriated by this Act shall be expended by the Board of Supervisors of the Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College in its discretion for the expansion of the facilities of the University at Chambers, provided that the expansion of those facilities shall be no more than is suitable and appropriate for the operation and maintenance of a two-year commuter's college at Chambers, unless further expansion or extension of those facilities is submitted to the electorate of the state for approval. Disbursements: 1959-1960 college.

Section 4. If any provision or item of this Act or the application thereof is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions, items or application and to this end the provisions of this Act are hereby declared severable. Severability.

Section 5. All laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. Repealing clause.

AN ACT

Making appropriation to the Charity Hospital of Louisiana at New Orleans out of the General Fund of the State of Louisiana for the fiscal year 1959-1960 in the amount of \$800,000.00 for capital outlay in the construction of warehouse and cold storage building and for repairs to the main hospital building.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Appropriation to New Orleans Charity Hospital to build warehouse, cold storage building, etc.

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated out of the General Fund of the State of Louisiana for the fiscal year 1959-1960 the sum of Eight Hundred Thousand (\$800,000.00) Dollars to the Charity Hospital of Louisiana at New Orleans for capital outlay in the construction of warehouse and cold storage building and for repairs to the main hospital building.

Repealing clause.

Section 2. All laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Division of State Buildings in the amount of \$145,271.26 out of the State General Fund, for the purpose of maintaining and operating the old Department of Highway* buildings located on

the State Capitol grounds as State offices and for making necessary repairs.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. That there is hereby appropriated out of the State General Fund the sum of One Hundred Forty-five Thousand Two Hundred Seventy-one and 26/100 (\$145,271.26) Dollars, to the Division of State Buildings for the purpose of maintaining and operating the old Department of Highway* buildings located on the State Capitol grounds as State offices and for making necessary repairs.

Appropriation for maintenance, operation and repairs of old highway buildings.

Section 2. That all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

AN ACT
